



At HVA, service is ingrained in our curriculum as we embrace the belief that Christ has called us to be His hands and feet on earth. Consequently, our students actively engage in service projects each year. During the most recent week of service, our students had the opportunity to participate in a diverse range of impactful projects, benefiting our local, national, and international communities. On campus, half of the student body dedicated their efforts to supporting the local Hagerstown community. Collaborating with ACTS9, Faith Step, and CIRCLES Washington County, our students stocked food pantries, diligently organized and cleaned these spaces, enhancing the efficiency of community programs.

Meanwhile, our Aerials Acro Team journeyed to Mt. Pisgah Academy, where they facilitated an inspirational week of prayer and served the neighboring community of Candler, North Carolina.

Internationally our students served in Santiago, Chile. While there HVA partnered with our sister school, John Andrews Academy, in La Reina. Together, they renovated homes for retired individuals and carried out essential landscaping projects for area schools.
